- Demonstrated understanding of the particular needs of clients from diverse communities, especially Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander and Multicultural clients and an ability to work effectively with support services for victims with specific needs;
- 5. Ability to deliver services in accordance with the WDVCAS Service Agreement, WDVCAP Principles, Policies and Standards and operational documents;
- 6. Excellent communication skills, particularly in negotiation, advocacy and conflict resolution;
- 7. High-level organisational, administrative, IT and management skills; and
- 8. Ability to develop and implement service delivery strategies aimed at ensuring the relevance, accessibility and responsiveness of Local Coordination Point services to a diverse range of women and children.
